Their low-profile and oversized diameter prevent wide-angle lens vignetting, and the inclusion of locking set screws and a wrench ensures secure attachment to the lens. Slip Mount Machine Vision Filters feature a 14mm inner diameter and are also compatible with M12 imaging lenses. These filters are designed with a Gaussian transmission curve and can achieve the output profile of common LED wavelengths when using a broadband light source.
